

SENIORS - - It's time to start the admissions process!!

Admissions and deadlines will start hitting this fall. Follow these steps to stay on track:

- ⇒ Complete your college visits and narrow your choices to 3 -4 schools.
- ⇒ Contact your top colleges NOW and ask about deadlines and the process for applying for admission, college-based scholarships and financial aid.
- Apply to your top 3-4 colleges before the deadline. Along with your application, the colleges will require your high school transcript, class rank, GPA and ACT/SAT score. They may also request a list of your extracurricular activities, letters of recommendation, an essay, and an interview.
- ⇒ Update your

 Activities Resume. Since extracurricular activities
 are an important
 part of the admissions application,
 keep them up-todate by using the

 Activities Resume at

 EducationQuest.org.
- ⇒ Contact your admissions representative periodically to stay informed about deadlines and campus activities.

Juniors... A guide for your journey to college

Fall / Winter:

- 1. Ask your school counselor if you're on track to meet academic requirements for college admission.
- 2. Get involved in extracurricular activities to increase your changes for scholarships and college admission.
- 3. Attend a Financial Aid Program to learn how to pay for college.
- 4. Attend a College Fair or Educational Planning Program to meet with college representatives.
- 5. Take a prep course for ACT college entrance exam.
- 6. Take the PSAT to prepare for the SAT college entrance exam and to see if you qualify for a National Merit Scholarship.
- 7. Visit **EducationQuest.org** to:
 - * Sign up for Countdown2College monthly email tips.
 - * Create or update your Activities Resume.
 - * Create a ScholarshipQuest profile to find Nebraska-based scholarships.
 - * Find dates and locations of Financial Aid Programs, Educational Planning Programs and College Fairs.

Spring:

- 1. Start narrowing down your college choices. Visit schools that interest you and attend a College Fair if offered in your area.
- 2. Take the ACT (required for all Nebraska high school juniors). You may also want to take the SAT.
- Become familiar with the FAFSA. You can complete it beginning Oct 1 of your senior year to apply for financial aid. Also complete the *College Funding Estimator* at **EducationQuest.org** to estimate your FAFSA results.

Summer:

- 1. Get a job and save as much as you can for college expenses.
- 2. Find job-shadowing opportunities in career areas that interest you.
- 3. Narrow your college choices to 3 or 4.
- 4. Update your Activities Resume.

Seniors . . . A guide for your journey to college

If your going to college during the 2017-2018 academic year, be aware that you can complete and submit the FAFSA beginning October 1, 2016 using 2015 income tax data.



Winter:

- 1. Apply for scholarships. Use *ScholarshipQuest* at **EducationQuest.org** to find Nebraska-based awards and a list of national scholarship sites.
- 2. Expect a Student Aid Report (SAR) acknowledging that your FAFSA was processed.
- 3. If requested by the college, submit documents that verify your FAFSA information.
- 4. Expect financial aid award notifications from the college(s) you listed on your FAFSA.
- 5. Watch for acceptance letters from the colleges you applied to.



Spring:

- 1. Compare financial aid award notifications to determine which college offers the best award package.
- 2. Continue to apply for scholarships.
- 3. Make your final college selection and notify the other schools of your decision.

Summer:

- 1. Apply for student and parent loans, if needed. Complete Student Loan Entrance Counseling at **student-loans.gov.**
- 2. Register for, and attend, new-student orientation at your college.
- 3. Save as much as you can from your summer job to help pay college expenses.





The FAFSA is the application for federal, state and college-based financial aid.

- ⇒ Before starting the FAFSA, create a Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID) at <u>fsaid.ed.gov</u> (one for you and one for a parent). The IDs are needed to access the FAFSA and other Federal Student Aid website. They also serve as your signature for the FAFSA.
- \Rightarrow You should complete the FAFSA beginning on or after October 1 but before your college's FAFSA priority date. Contact the college(s) to learn their priority dates.
- ⇒ Colleges will use the results of the FAFSA to determine how much they will award in financial aid. This could be a combination of scholarships, grants, work-study and student loans.

Lexile Reading Levels

Elementary students recently finished their winter testing and now have an updated lexile level. During library time, students choose two books to check out. One book is purely of their choice on any reading and/or interest level. The other book chosen by the student must be within their lexile reading level according to their MAP and AIMs web scores from January 2017. (This practice excludes the preschool students). The lexile books read by each student are kept track of weekly and kept on file in the library for teacher and student reference.

A Little More About Lexile:

Grace Ankeny

Our students receive a lexile level range based on their performance on the MAP and Aims Web assessments. The higher the Lexile measure, the higher the student's reading level. The reader's Lexile Framework works in intervals of five with 5L being the lowest. The highest possible measure is 2000L. Anything below 5L is assessed as a BR or Beginning Reader.

Lexile levels are scientifically and mathematically assigned based on the difficulty and readability of a book. Once you know your child's Lexile level, you can search for books that match this level to expand your home library and encourage daily reading practice in your own home. Use the Lexile database (lexile.com) to search by Lexile level, title, or subject to find books your child will enjoy and be able to read without becoming discouraged at his or her reading achievement. Contact your child's teacher to obtain his/her most current lexile level.

Read Across America Week/Dr. Seuss Celebration

This year, Allen Elementary School will be hosting a week-long celebration of reading and the life of famed author Dr. Seuss. This celebration will take place Monday <u>February 27-Friday March 3rd</u>. Classes will participate in a door decorating contest themed around a favorite class book, dress up days, and activities during library, computer, and reading classes that week themed around Dr. Seuss.
