PRESCRIPTIONS AND MEDICATIONS

Students needing prescriptions or over -the- counter medications at school must have written permission from a physician or dentist and written permission from their parent/guardian.

Medications such as Tylenol and Ibuprofen will not be available at school for student use with out permission.

Students are not allowed to carry any medications with them or to keep any medications in their lockers or vehicles. Any student needing or wanting to carry medications with them (such as an asthma inhaler) must have a permission form signed by their physician and parent/guardian. These forms are available at the school office. Any over-the-counter medications or prescription medications given here at the school will be administered through the Principal's office. The medications must be provided to the school in the original prescription bottle and will only be given as

directed on the bottle. Any change in the dose or frequency/ times must be accompanied by written physical permission form. We must have a parent/ guardian completed and signed permission form on file. These forms are also available at the principal's office. All medication that is to be given must be taken to the Principal's Office. Please do not send medications that have to be administered three times a day. Most can be safely given before school, after school, and at bedtime. Anyone giving medications in school must be designated by a registered nurse and pass a thorough medication provider course.







Requirements

Nebraska law requires that all students in Nebraska schools, grades K-12 have varicella vaccines or written proof of the chicken pox disease prior to starting school in August 2016.

- ⇒ Kindergarteners must have a physical, eye exam, and kindergarten shots (including the 2 doses of varicella) prior to the first day of school.
- ⇒ <u>7th graders</u> must have a physical, tetanus booster and 2 doses of varicella or written proof of the disease, prior to the first day of school. All students in grades 7-12 who are going to participate in athletics must have a physical exam. Students may not participate with the team without evidence of the physical exam.

7-12 ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS PLEASE READ!

Dear Parent,

It is difficult to believe we are already talking about back-to-school, but in a few weeks, we will be kicking off the new 2016-17 school year. Wednesday, August 17th will be the first day of classes with an early dismissal of 1:30 pm. I'd like to mention just a few key points regarding grades and eligibility for parents who may have students in grades 7-12 for the first time this year.

In order to help students be as successful as possible, we have implemented some requirements for students who may be struggling in class. The first is known as "lunch bunch" and it is held during 7-12 lunchtime. Each morning, students are identified who are failing two or more classes are (for either the current quarter or semester), and they take their lunches to a classroom where they can work on homework when they are done eating. I believe the most important part of this time however, is that it gives me time to show them their grades and talk about what they can do to improve. We check to see if they have late or missing work, need to talk to a teacher about an assignment, or need to study for an upcoming test. In addition, we have had parents request that a student have lunch bunch every day, even if they are not failing two or more classes.

There is always a lot of confusion regarding eligibility for participation in activities. The official policy is included following this letter, but in brief, students need to be passing four academic classes (20 credit hours) in order to be eligible (as opposed to failing any certain number of classes). NSAA requires this condition on a semester to semester basis. In addition, grades are run at the end of every week, and students who are not passing at least four academic classes (for both the current quarter and semester) are ineligible for Monday through Saturday of the following week. Finally, we are also going to identify students who are failing *any* classes, and these students will need to put in time (one hour per failing class) the following week in order to keep their eligibility. We are hoping this added "safety net" will put the emphasis on student effort, and provide an additional opportunity to keep students eligible.

If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to call. Our goal is to be proactive in identifying students who need help before the problem becomes unmanageable. We want to help them to be as successful as possible!

All 7-12 students are expected to have on file each year an NSAA student/parent consent form that spells out the expectations that students must abide by in order to maintain their eligibility to participate in NSAA activities. The specific activities are identified on the consent form.

Specific activity eligibility guidelines are discussed in the Student Handbook. Students and parents agree to follow and abide by these eligibility rules to maintain their activity eligibility. Student and parents signatures on the acknowledgement form indicate their understanding and agreement to abide by these activity guidelines.

NSAA eligibility rules from semester to semester shall be followed. (*NSAA states that students who have not passed 20 core hours the previous semester are ineligible for NSAA sponsored activities.*)

Incoming 9th grade students will be required to pass the equivalent of twenty hours of academic credit (*this would be 4 out of 5 classes including math, English, science, social studies, and quarter elective classes*) in the immediate preceding semester of 8th grade. 8th grade students not passing twenty hours of academic classes in their second semester of study will be given the opportunity to attend summer school in order to remain eligible for the fall semester of their 9th grade year.

The down list will be run weekly for any students having Ds or Fs in any classes for the quarter or the semester, and down letters will be mailed home, with the exception of the first and last week of each quarter.

When that down list is run, students not passing twenty hours of credit in the current quarter and/or semester will be ineligible for participation the following week, running from the following Monday through Saturday.

Students who do not fall under the criteria in B above, but who have any failing grades in either the quarter or the semester when that down list is run, will be in danger of being ineligible, but will be allowed to earn back their eligibility based on the following requirements. Students must report to Academic Assistance the following week, for a total of <u>#</u> hours (one hour per failing class up to 3 hours) or until the grade is improved to passing.

Students may pick from the following times:

Monday – Friday: 7:15 – 8:00 am
Monday – Friday: 12:35 – 1:05 pm
Monday – Friday: After School (Only by appointment and in the event of a conflict such as One Act practice.)

At the end of the week, a student may fall under the following circumstances:

Time served and/or the grade is improved; student is released from Academic Assistance for the following week. Student is ELIGIBLE for all activities the following week.

Time served but the grade is NOT improved; student is held over for Academic Assistance for the following week, but student is ELIGIBLE for all activities the following week as long as they continue to attend Academic Assistance.

Time **<u>NOT</u>** Served and the grade is not improved; student is held over for Academic Assistance <u>**AND**</u> student will be ineligible for <u>**ALL**</u> Activities the next week.

School activities in which a student will be considered ineligible during the ineligibility period under any of the criteria above include **<u>but are not limited</u>** to the following:

• Sports competitions

• Science Fair competitions

• Pep band performances

Dances

• Art Shows

- Music Performances (including concerts)
- Competitive Speech performances
- One Act performances

Change To Labels for Education,[®] February 2016



As of the 2016-2017 school year there will no longer be labels for education. After 42 years the program has declined considerably and it is at the point they have made the decision to wind down the program.
