## SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER

One of the things that we focus on at Allen Consolidated Schools with the start of the new semester is the MAP testing. MAP is a computer generated test that measures the level at which your student is performing compared to the Nebraska State Standards. The MAP test will be taken by our K-8 grades as well as our freshman and sophomores. The reports that can be generated by the MAP test will help guide teachers in the development of curriculum and standards that they teach in their class. This is a valuable tool that could help our students become more proficient learners and help our teachers become even better at educating your sons or daughters. During parent teacher conferences held on February 23<sup>rd</sup> you will be able to see how your children did on the MAP tests. Teachers will take the time to go over their scores and show you how we they are doing at mastering the Nebraska state standards and how they compare with other students across the nation who takes the MAP assessments.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind parents that if your son or daughter is sick please make sure they are symptom free for 24 hours before returning them to school. We appreciate your students wanting to be in school, but it is better for every-one if we are not sending sick children to school.

As always we welcome anybody to come and visit the school. Allen is a great community with great teachers and great students. We want to invite anybody in the community to come check out all of the wonderful things that are taking place. Whenever you come up to visit, stop in the front office, sign in and take a look for yourself. If you ever have any questions or concerns about what is going on with your student and their education, you are always welcome to come and visit with the administration or to call.

If you calculate that by the 90 days we have been in session this school year, that is a cost savings of \$630.00. Not only is the car cost efficient, Allen Consolidated Schools has also reduced carbon dioxide emissions by over 6,000 pounds in the last 90 days. ## **Safety and Crisis Information**

Students and staff and Allen School have been practicing different types of lock down and safety drills throughout the year. In the event that we would ever have to evacuate the building for any reason, our Parent Reunification Site will be the Methodist Church, 402 Summit Drive, Allen. In the case of an emergency, we would ask that parents and community members keep the following in mind:

- Parents and relatives should not respond to the incident site (**school**) or evacuation site (**Lutheran Church**) to allow public safety personnel time to respond to the incident.
- Students will be released only to approved adults with photo identification, at the reunification site (**Methodist Church**).
- All members of the community should avoid driving anywhere within several blocks of the incident site.
- All members of the community should avoid using cellular phones for the first several hours of the situation. This is to help keep cellular phone service from collapsing, as it has in a number of school crisis events. School and public safety officials may be heavily reliant on cellular service during a crisis.
- Concerned parties should not call the school, school board members, or public safety dispatch centers to get information regarding the incident or particular students and employees. Personnel at these locations will be extremely busy, and often do not have information regarding each evacuee. Inquiries severely hamper efforts to manage the crisis properly.

We certainly hope we **NEVER** have to actually use these procedures, but we want to be as prepared and responsive as we can possibly be if we do. Thank you!

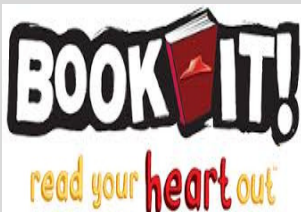

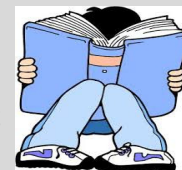

## News from the Library!



The Pizza Hut Book IT! program has been successful so far this school year! During the month of October, 55 elementary students turned in a completed reading goal calendar. In November, 40 students turned in their calendar with an acceptable goal met. December Book IT! calendars will be due after Christmas break by Thursday January 5, 2017. Look for a January calendar and note in your child's planner. I appreciate your help at home encouraging your child to read their goal number of minutes per day. Thank you!

During the month of January, we will focus on reading fantasy books aloud during elementary reading time. Students will discuss elements of the genre appropriate to their grade levels. Sample fantasy books will be displayed in the library at various reading levels for students to browse and check out.



K-6<sup>th</sup> grade computer classes will continue working towards typing goals during the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester of the school year. Most 3-6 graders have met the first semester goal of reaching lesson 40 in the typing program and will build from there. K-1<sup>st</sup> graders will just begin the typing program after working on basic mouse and typing skills the first semester. 2<sup>nd</sup> graders had a goal of reaching lesson 20 before the end of the first semester and most students have successfully attained that goal. Google docs will be a focus for all grades K-6 this semester. We will be incorporating learnings from class into projects for our class as well as in other subject areas.

**SENIORS - - -**  
**It's time to start the admissions process!!**

Admissions and deadlines will start hitting this fall. Follow these steps to stay on track:

- ⇒ **Complete your college visits** and narrow your choices to 3–4 schools.
- ⇒ **Contact your top colleges NOW** and ask about deadlines and the process for applying for admission, college-based scholarships and financial aid.
- ⇒ **Apply to your top 3–4 colleges before the deadline.** Along with your application, the colleges will require your high school transcript, class rank, GPA and ACT/SAT score. They may also request a list of your extracurricular activities, letters of recommendation, an essay, and an interview.
- ⇒ **Update your Activities Resume.** Since extracurricular activities are an important part of the admissions application, keep them up-to-date by using the Activities Resume at **EducationQuest.org**.
- ⇒ **Contact your admissions representative periodically** to stay informed about deadlines and campus activities.

## FROM THE COUNSELOR'S OFFICE

**Happy New Year! The first half of the school year seemed to fly by. This is a very busy time for our students. Senior parents, please continue supporting your child as they make decisions about college and continue your scholarship searches. If you have not filed your FASFA do so in the near future. Some scholarships require FASFA information, such as the Susan Buffett Scholarship. The deadlines will be approaching in early spring. Also, remind your senior to check once a week in the guidance office for new scholarship opportunities.**

**The Juniors will be offered the John Baylor ACT test prep in January. This is a free service to our students and can greatly increase your child's ACT score. This test preparation will be a great benefit to the students as there is a new state requirement for Juniors beginning this year. The NeSA test once given to Juniors will be replaced by the ACT test. The test date this year is April 19<sup>th</sup>. This test is offered at no cost and can be used as a college entrance score. There will be more details in the next few months. If you have any questions feel free to contact Mrs. Kneifl or Mr. Pattee at school.**

### ***Juniors. . . A guide for your journey to college***

#### **Fall / Winter:**

1. Ask your school counselor if you're on track to meet academic requirements for college admission.
2. Get involved in extracurricular activities to increase your chances for scholarships and college admission.
3. Attend a Financial Aid Program to learn how to pay for college.
4. Attend a College Fair or Educational Planning Program to meet with college representatives.
5. Take a prep course for ACT college entrance exam.
6. Take the PSAT to prepare for the SAT college entrance exam and to see if you qualify for a National Merit Scholarship.
7. Visit **EducationQuest.org** to:
  - \* Sign up for *Countdown2College* monthly email tips.
  - \* Create or update your *Activities Resume*.
  - \* Create a *ScholarshipQuest* profile to find Nebraska-based scholarships.
  - \* Find dates and locations of Financial Aid Programs, Educational Planning Programs and College Fairs.



#### **Spring:**

1. Start narrowing down your college choices. Visit schools that interest you and attend a College Fair if offered in your area.
2. Take the ACT (required for all Nebraska high school juniors). You may also want to take the SAT.
3. Become familiar with the FAFSA. You can complete it beginning Oct 1 of your senior year to apply for financial aid. Also complete the *College Funding Estimator* at **EducationQuest.org** to estimate your FAFSA results.

#### **Summer:**

1. Get a job and save as much as you can for college expenses.
2. Find job-shadowing opportunities in career areas that interest you.
3. Narrow your college choices to 3 or 4.
4. Update your *Activities Resume*.

### Seniors . . . A guide for your journey to college

*If your going to college during the 2017-2018 academic year, be aware that you can complete and submit the FAFSA beginning October 1, 2016 using 2015 income tax data.*



#### Winter:

1. Apply for scholarships. Use *ScholarshipQuest* at **EducationQuest.org** to find Nebraska-based awards and a list of national scholarship sites.
2. Expect a Student Aid Report (SAR) acknowledging that your FAFSA was processed.
3. If requested by the college, submit documents that verify your FAFSA information.
4. Expect financial aid award notifications from the college(s) you listed on your FAFSA.
5. Watch for acceptance letters from the colleges you applied to.



#### Spring:

1. Compare financial aid award notifications to determine which college offers the best award package.
2. Continue to apply for scholarships.
3. Make your final college selection and notify the other schools of your decision.

#### Summer:

1. Apply for student and parent loans, if needed. Complete Student Loan Entrance Counseling at **student-loans.gov**.
2. Register for, and attend, new-student orientation at your college.
3. Save as much as you can from your summer job to help pay college expenses.



#### The FAFSA is the application for federal, state and college-based financial aid.



⇒ Before starting the FAFSA, create a Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID) at [fsaid.ed.gov](https://fsaid.ed.gov) (one for you and one for a parent). The IDs are needed to access the FAFSA and other Federal Student Aid web-site. They also serve as your signature for the FAFSA.

⇒ You should complete the FAFSA beginning on or after October 1 but before your college's FAFSA priority date. Contact the college(s) to learn their priority dates.

⇒ Colleges will use the results of the FAFSA to determine how much they will award in financial aid. This could be a combination of scholarships, grants, work-study and student loans.

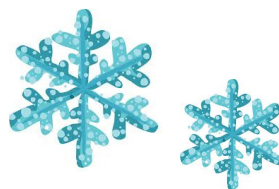
### ONE ACT DEPARTMENT
