Throughout the day the Edgerton leaders were doing interactive experiments with our students at all different grade levels that were both engaging and thought provoking. This was a great way to explore science and bring families together for an evening that was entertaining as well as educational. Thank you to all who participated and to our extremely dedicated staff members.

Due to the cancellation of parent teacher conferences on February 23rd I encourage all of our parents or guardians to contact teachers if they have any questions about the education of their children. March and April mark the beginning of the state testing season at Allen Consolidated Schools. One of the major changes in our state testing for the 2016-2017 school year is that all Juniors will be required to take the ACT instead of the NeSA assessment. The change from NeSA to the ACT was a result of the Nebraska Legislature passing Bill 930 into law in April of 2016. The scores that the students receive on the ACT can be used on applications for admissions to colleges and universities. At Allen our juniors will be taking the ACT on April 19th. It is imperative that all juniors attend that day so that we can comply with the state regulation that all juniors need to take this assessment. 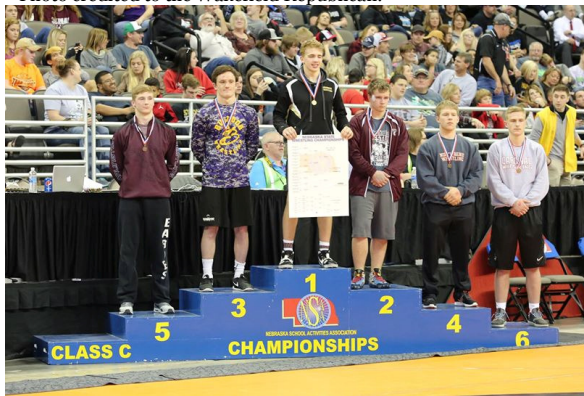

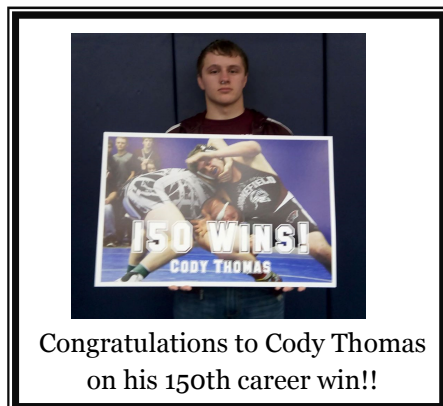

FROM THE COUNSELOR'S OFFICE

Seniors . . . A guide for your journey to college

If you going to college during the 2017-2018 academic year, be aware that you can complete and submit the FAFSA beginning October 1, 2016 using 2015 income tax data.

Spring:

1. Compare financial aid award notifications to determine which college offers the best award package.
2. Continue to apply for scholarships.
3. Make your final college selection and notify the other schools of your decision.

Summer:

1. Apply for student and parent loans, if needed. Complete Student Loan Entrance Counseling at **student-loans.gov**.
2. Register for, and attend, new-student orientation at your college.
3. Save as much as you can from your summer job to help pay college expenses.

Juniors. . . A guide for your journey to college

Spring:

1. Start narrowing down your college choices. Visit schools that interest you and attend a College Fair if offered in your area.
2. Take the ACT (required for all Nebraska high school juniors). You may also want to take the SAT.
3. Become familiar with the FAFSA. You can complete it beginning Oct 1 of your senior year to apply for financial aid. Also complete the *College Funding Estimator* at **EducationQuest.org** to estimate your FAFSA results.

Summer:

1. Get a job and save as much as you can for college expenses.
2. Find job-shadowing opportunities in career areas that interest you.
3. Narrow your college choices to 3 or 4.
4. Update your *Activities Resume*.



The FAFSA is the application for federal, state and college-based financial aid.

- ⇒ Before starting the FAFSA, create a Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID) at fsaid.ed.gov (one for you and one for a parent). The IDs are needed to access the FAFSA and other Federal Student Aid website. They also serve as your signature for the FAFSA.
- ⇒ You should complete the FAFSA beginning on or after October 1 but before your college's FAFSA priority date. Contact the college(s) to learn their priority dates.
- ⇒ Colleges will use the results of the FAFSA to determine how much they will award in financial aid. This could be a combination of scholarships, grants, work-study and student loans.

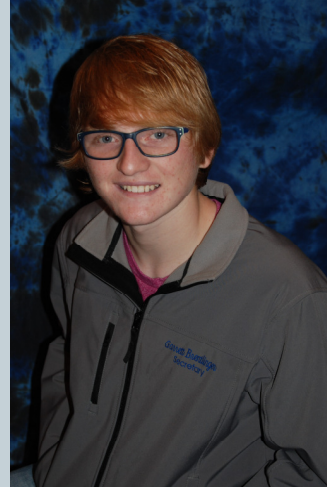

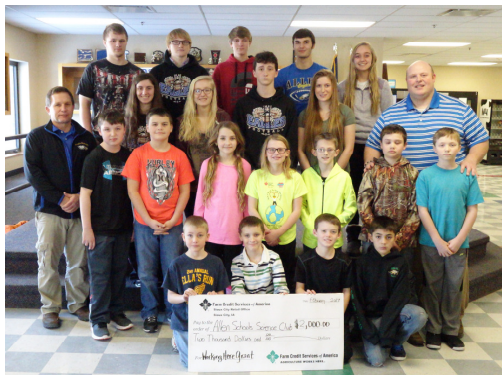

SIOUX CITY, IOWA – Allen Consolidated Schools Science Club received a \$2,000 *Working Here Fund* grant for their STEM coding with drones program. The grant is provided through Farm Credit Services of America’s (FCSAmerica) *Working Here Fund*.
