Allen students kicked off the 2016-17 school year on Wednesday, August 17, and we now have our first full week of school firmly under our belts. This fall, students will be able to track their homework using "myHomework", either online with a computer or on any mobile device using the app. This app is basically a digital version of a paper-and-pen planner. Every student will have an individual login and password and will be able to see their classes and homework there. For junior high students, this information will be loaded for them, while freshmen and sophomores will have to enter a few classes on their own, juniors a few more, and seniors will have to enter all homework on their own. (All students will still have the option of using regular planners of course.) When possible, we want to use available technology to make learning and success more likely!

Push notifications alerts all users who have installed the app on a mobile device of new messages or events even when the user is not actively using the App.



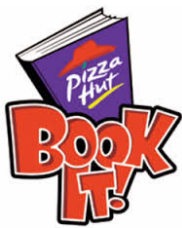

Welcome back to another wonderful year at Allen! Huge changes have made their way to our school's library. Over the summer I have been working hard to reorganize and revamp our materials, resources, and texts. A more spacious learning space now exists with easier access to fiction and non-fiction books, periodicals, and the school's laptops, chrome books, and iPads.

Brand new to our library is an updated library circulation system. It is called Destiny and has a wide array of information available for students and faculty. The Preschool through 6th grade students will spend time with me learning how to use the program to find books and information that they want to read or need for an assignment in class. The tools with this new program are endless and I am thrilled to be able to show students and faculty what we can do!



Starting this month, Preschool-6th grade students will take part in the Pizza Hut Book It Program. As the librarian, I will encourage the students to read, Read, READ! Special Education

COUNSELOR'S OFFICE

Senior Students and parents . . . Start preparing for college admission.

Admission deadlines will start hitting later this fall. Follow these steps to stay on track:

1. Contact your top colleges and ask about application deadlines for admission, college-based scholarships and financial aid.
2. Visit with college representatives at College Fairs, Educational Planning Programs during campus visits, and when they visit your high school.
3. Apply to your top 3-4 colleges before the deadline. Along with your application, the colleges will require your high school transcripts, class rank, GPA and ACT/SAT score. They may also request a list of your extracurricular activities, letters of recommendation, and essay and an interview.
4. Ask if your school is holding an Apply2College event this fall. If so, you can complete your college applications during the school day and get help from school, college and community volunteers.

Before you attend a college fair visit www.NebraskaCollegeFairs.org to register for a barcode. Print and take that barcode to the fair so that college reps can scan it to retrieve your demographic information. You should also register a barcode if you plan to attend an Educational Planning Program (EPP).

- * Juniors and seniors, attend a Financial Aid Program.
- * Juniors and seniors, attend a College Fair or Educational Planning Program (EPP) in your area.
- * Before you attend a College Fair or EPP, register for a barcode at NebraskaCollegeFairs.org.
- * Seniors, register by September 1 for the October 1 SAT.
- * Seniors, register by September 16 for the October 22 ACT.
- * Juniors, ask your school counselor about PSAT registration deadlines and test dates.

Seniors . . . It's time to prepare for the early FAFSA!

Beginning October 1st, you can apply for federal, state and college-based financial aid by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). This is a change from previous years when students had to wait until after January 1 to apply.

Here is how you can prepare:

- ⇒ **Create a Federal Student Aid (FSA) Id** for you and one for your parent at fsaid.ed.gov. You and a parent will each need a FSA ID to access and sign up for the FAFSA.
- ⇒ **Be aware of your college's FAFSA priority date.** Complete your FAFSA before that date as some financial aid is awarded first come first served. Contact your college's financial aid office to learn their priority date.
- ⇒ **Attend an EducationQuest Financial Aid Program (FAP)** to learn about the FAFSA and the financial aid process. If you attend, *you'll be eligible to register for a \$500 scholarship!* FAP's will be held at high schools across the state. Ask Mrs. Kneifl for dates and locations.
- ⇒ **See FAFSA Tools at EducationQuest.org** for free tools that will help you prepare. For free personal help, call the EducationQuest location nearest you to make an appointment: Omaha - 888.537.6300; Lincoln - 800.303.3745; Kearney - 800.666.3745; and Scottsbluff - 800.303.3745 ext. 6654.

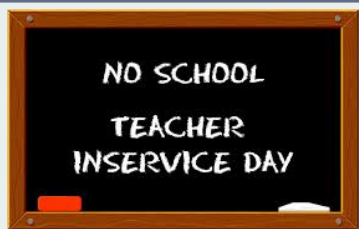

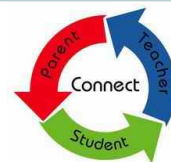

Welcome back to school! I am looking forward to a busy school year where we will be focusing on improvement in areas of reading and math.

Important dates to remember are the week of **September 6th-9th**. We have set these as the tentative days to test the Elementary and Jr. High students in the areas of reading and math. We use AIMSWEB to test our students and look forward to the new format that the company is implementing this year.

As part of our monthly newsletter, I will be including a few activities that parents may choose to implement with their children at home that are both educational and fun.

Kindergarten and First Grade

- Have your child point out numbers on clocks, appliances, calendars, pages of books, road signs, or anywhere that you might see them. Focus on smaller numbers for your Kindergarten students and larger numbers up to 100 for first grade.
- Play the Simon Says game. Have your child do an activity a certain number of times. For example, Simon says clap five times.

Second Grade and Third Grade

- Have your child help make a grocery list with specific numbers of items like 6 apples or numerical words like four tomatoes. Make a list of 4-6 items that your child can help you find.
- Make a set of index cards with numerical words on them using words like three, four, and five. Hold the card up and have your child do an activity like clapping hands four times, or washing two spoons. The key to it all is to make learning fun at home.

Annual notice provided to parents/guardians and eligible students of their rights to inspect and review educational records, amend education records, consent to disclose personally identifiable information in education records and file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education.



Allen Consolidated Schools Improves Student Safety with TIPS

Just a reminder: the TIPS reporting link is on the school website and can be used to allow the anonymous reporting of bullying, weapons, abuse, vandalism, suicide risks and other concerning behaviors that may have a negative effect on the school's learning environment. TIPS can also be used to report acts of kindness or other make positive comments in something called a Hero report.

How it works: if you are worried about friends, students or others, or if you witness concerning behaviors, simply go to the Allen School website (www.allenschools.org) and click on the TIPS REPORT INCIDENT button. Select the appropriate incident type, share the necessary details and then SUBMIT.

Once an incident report is made, the principal and designated staff members are immediately notified via email and can securely review the report details to begin coordinating an appropriate assessment and response. TIPS provides all team members with the right tools to track and document the actions taken, see related reports, set automated reminders, review past reports, check school policy, and connect the right dots so no students or incidents are overlooked.

Please keep in mind that due to confidentiality issues, it may not be possible for reporters to be informed on how their report was handled and/or how the situation was resolved.

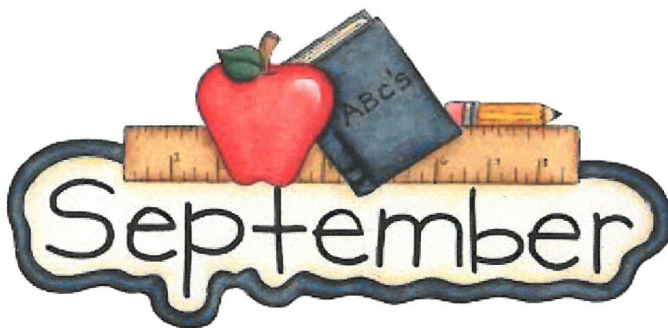
