SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of our students, parents, coaches, and sponsors for all of their support and encouragement during the winter season. Without the cooperation of everyone involved we would not have successful programs at the school. Congratulations to all of our students, coaches, and sponsors who took the time and effort to be a part of any activity this winter. It is hard to believe but the winter season is half over and the spring/track season is right around the corner.

At the January Board of Education meeting for Allen Consolidated Schools, it was approved to enter into a sports cooperative with Emerson-Hubbard Public Schools starting in the 2020-2021 school year. The agreement includes the following activities: Junior High Football, Junior High Volleyball, Junior High Wrestling, Junior High Boys and Girls Basketball, Junior High Track, Varsity Volleyball, Varsity Girls and Boys Basketball, Varsity Boys and Girls Golf, Dance and Cheer, and Varsity Track. Administrators from both schools are currently working on schedules and locations for events and practices. When creating the schedules the goal has been to hold practices and events as fairly as possible in both towns. When activities such as games and practices are held in Emerson, Allen will continue to provide transportation for those students involved. Allen is excited about working with Emerson-Hubbard and developing a strong working relationship to help both schools succeed in the future. The name, colors, and mascot for this new cooperative is currently being developed by students from both schools. A final decision will be made by representative from both the Emerson-Hubbard and Allen student councils.

Just a reminder as the weather continues to be an issue in the next few months Allen Consolidated schools will continue to use local television stations and the ADT Tyco Alert calling system as the main sources to report school information relating to late starts or cancellations. Decisions about a possible late start or no school will be made as soon as possible the morning of the inclement weather. As soon as the decision is made information will be posted to the local television stations and an ADT Tyco Alert call will be made.

We will be communicating with other area schools and hopefully will make a decision as to a weather related two-hour late start or closing as soon as possible. Occasionally a decision can be made either for a two-hour late start or a closing the night before. In the case of severe weather please check the 10:00 pm Sioux City news for up-to-date late start and closing information.

Allen Consolidated Schools Improves Student Safety with TIPS

Just a reminder: the TIPS reporting link is on the school website and can be used to allow the anonymous reporting of bullying, weapons, abuse, vandalism, suicide risks and other concerning behaviors that may have a negative effect on the school’s learning environment. TIPS can also be used to report acts of kindness or other make positive comments in something called a Hero report.

How it works: if you are worried about friends, students or others, or if you witness concerning behaviors, simply go to the Allen School website (www.allenschools.org) and click on the TIPS REPORT INCIDENT button. Select the appropriate incident type, share the necessary details and then SUBMIT.

Once an incident report is made, the principal and designated staff members are immediately notified via email and can securely review the report details to begin coordinating an appropriate assessment and response. TIPS provides all team members with the right tools to track and document the actions taken, see related reports, set automated reminders, review past reports, check school policy, and connect the right dots so no students or incidents are overlooked.

Please keep in mind that due to confidentiality issues, it may not be possible for reporters to be informed on how their report was handled and/or how the situation was resolved.

Seniors...make sure you complete the FAFSA process

1. Getting financial aid for college involves more than completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Complete each step of the process so that you don't miss out on money for college.
2. **If you haven't already, complete your 2020-21 FAFSA** at FAFSA.gov using 2018 income tax data. Before you start, you and a parent must each get an FSA ID at fsaid.ed.gov as you'll need them to access and sign your FAFSA.
3. **Expect a Student Aid Report (SAR) via an email link.** The SAR acknowledges that your FAFSA was received and lets you know if you need to take further action before the form can be processed.
4. **You might receive a verification notice** from the college(s) you listed on your FAFSA requesting documents to verify your FAFSA information. The college will not process your financial aid until you provide required documents.
5. **Watch for financial aid award notifications.** Once you're accepted for admission to the colleges you listed on your FAFSA, they will notify you of the types and amounts of financial aid they're offering.

Watch your email and student portal carefully for important details about admission and financial aid.

What you need to know about scholarships

Most scholarships are based on academics, but others are based on community service, school involvement, or talent. Some are based on financial need as determined by the results of your FAFSA.

Here's what to look for scholarships:

1. **ScholarshipQuest** at EducationQuest.org houses over 2,000 Nebraska-based scholarships. After you create a profile, you'll be matched with scholarships that fit your criteria.
2. **Your school counselors office.** Visit regularly to check on local and national awards.
3. **The college you plan to attend.** Contact the school for a list of scholarships they provide and the application procedures.
4. **National search sites** such as College Board, Peterson's, and Chegg.
5. **Other resources** could include your coach, clubs, and organizations, and your parent's employers and civic organizations.

Nebraska students in grades 9-12 are invited to pursue these \$500 scholarships from EducationQuest:

- ◆ **Get Social Scholarship** - By following EducationQuest on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram, you can enter into a drawing for \$500 scholarship each time we hit another 250 followers.
- ◆ **Scavenger Hunt Scholarship** - Create a ScholarshipQuest profile at EducationQuest.org and then scavenge around the EducationQuest website to find answers on a survey. The deadline to apply is **March 31**. We'll draw two winners from those who answer all questions correctly.

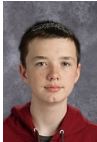

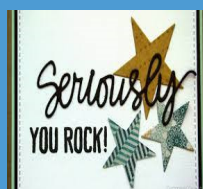


Senior, **Brogan Jones of Allen High School**, was selected to play in the Sertoma 8 man all star football game this summer at Hastings College.

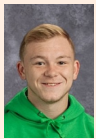

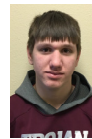

## **Are you new to the Allen School District or have you had an addition to your family?**

The School District Census Report is a requirement from the Department of Education that is due every July for children ages 0 - 21 that reside in our school district. These numbers are used by the Nebraska Department of Education for state aid and for federal funding. This list is also used to invite children who are eligible to be enrolled in Pre-School and Kindergarten each spring.

If you are new to our district or know of anyone who is new to our district you are encouraged to contact the school to provide us information. State statute and board policy requires that the school district establishes a permanent, continuing census of all children age 0 - 21, and to maintain this census on yearly basis.

The Nebraska Department of Education is in the process of unifying language for safety procedures across schools in the state. The procedures requiring action are called “Standard Response Protocol” and consist of 4 main actions—lockout, lockdown, evacuate, and shelter. According to NDE, the Standard Response Protocol “is the uniform classroom immediate response to any incident. Protocol not only enables rapid response determination when an unforeseen incident occurs but also allows for a more predictable series of actions as an incident unfolds. By standardizing the vocabulary, everyone immediately involved can understand the response and status of the incident.”

Here at school, we will be practicing drills based on these four actions and discussing ways to improve our response effectiveness and timing. If you come to school and see a sign on the door, it will give information and indicate the type of drill being practiced. Please don't be alarmed, and just know that we are practicing so that we can better protect our students. **In the event that we would ever need to evacuate the building for any reason, our Parent Reunification Site will be the Methodist Church, 402 Summit Drive, Allen.**

**In the case of an emergency, we would ask that parents and community members keep the following in mind:**

- Parents and relatives should **NOT** respond to the incident site (**school**) to allow public safety personnel time to respond to the incident.
- Students will be released only to approved adults at the evacuation/reunification site (**Methodist Church**).
- All members of the community should avoid driving anywhere within several blocks of the incident or evacuation/reunification site.
- All members of the community should avoid using cellular phones for the first several hours of the situation. This is to help keep cellular phone service from collapsing, as it has in a number of school crisis events. School and public safety officials may be heavily reliant on cellular service during a crisis.
- Concerned parties should not call the school, school board members, or public safety dispatch centers to get information regarding the incident or particular students and employees. Personnel at these locations will be extremely busy, and often do not have information regarding each evacuee. Inquiries severely hamper efforts to manage the crisis properly.

We certainly hope we **NEVER** have to actually use these procedures, but we want to be as prepared and responsive as we can possibly be if we do.
