PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Welcome back to the beginning of another exciting school year at Allen Consolidated Schools! It is an honor and a privilege to be a part of this school system, and I look forward to another successful year here at Allen!

We will be continuing the tradition of having a "Back to School Night". All preschool through sixth grade parents are invited to come to school between 6:00-7:00 p.m. on Tuesday evening, August 14th. During this time we will invite parents to tour class-

rooms and meet staff members. This event is a wonderful opportunity to experience your child's classroom, receive first-hand information regarding goals and expectations for the upcoming school year, as well as to meet with teachers and administration and discuss any questions you might have. We will also use this opportunity to have parents return the necessary forms (that have been mailed out) at the end of the visit. In addition, Mrs. Kneifl is providing 7th grade students and their parents an orientation at 6:30 p.m. starting in the lunchroom that same evening—this will be good time for our new JH students to set up their lockers, walk through their schedules, and get acclimated in a lower stress environment.

Students in grades 7-12 will need to go to PowerSchool to see a copy of their schedule for this year. Credit checks have been completed for all students in grades 10-12. Drop and add can be done through the office during the first full week of classes (until Friday, August 24th), but it would be best if students would discuss schedule changes both at home and with Mrs. Oswald to make sure all requirements are being met. Please feel free to contact the school at any time if you have class requirement or scheduling questions.

I would also like make all JH parents aware that I will be I will be meeting with JH students every day during lunch for at least the first few weeks of school to make sure they have their planners filled out, and to check in on how they are doing. I will also be posting all JH homework online during the first 3 quarters of school at: <http://new.schoolnotes.com/ljoswald/>. Homework will be listed as attachments, week by week, at the bottom of that website page. I cannot guarantee I will get every day listed since I may be gone or occupied on some days, but I will do my best. My goal is to try to get students to establish good homework habits right away and to head off any problems before they begin.

Finally, I want to mention that there has been a slight change in activity eligibility this year. As always, the school will run a weekly check on the morning of the last day of school that week. If any student in grades 7-12 is failing one or more classes, he/she will be placed on academic probation for that week (but will still be eligible). If the student fails to raise that grade to a passing level (70% or better) during that week, the student will then be declared ineligible for participation in extracurricular activities for the ensuing calendar week. The ineligible student will remain on the ineligible list, on a weekly basis, until such time the student's grades are considered passing (70% or better). Conversely, if the student does raise his grades to 70% or better during the probationary week, the student will be declared eligible for participation.

Serving as 7-12 Principal is a great honor and responsibility and I look forward to working with you again this year. I would like to invite all of our new families to visit the school and share in the pride of being an Allen Eagle supporter!

TIPS REMINDER

Allen Consolidated school provides a TIPS reporting link on the school website which can be used to allow the anonymous reporting of bullying, weapons, abuse, vandalism, suicide risks and other concerning behaviors that may have a negative effect on the school's learning environment. TIPS can also be used to report acts of kindness or other positive comments in something called a Hero report.

How it works: if you are worried about friends, students or others, or if you witness concerning behaviors, simply go to the Allen School website (www.allenschools.org) and click on the TIPS REPORT INCIDENT button. Select the appropriate incident type, share the necessary details and then SUBMIT.

Once an incident report is made, the principal and designated staff members are immediately notified via email and can securely review the report details to begin coordinating an appropriate assessment and response. TIPS provides all team members with the right tools to track and document the actions taken, see related reports, set automated reminders, review past reports, check school policy, and connect the right dots so no students or incidents are overlooked.



Fridays at NECC!!

The Seniors at Allen Consolidated Schools will again be involved in Fridays at Northeast Community College! This exciting program will give high school seniors the opportunity to spend Fridays on campus as college students using the Northeast Community College lab spaces and classrooms. Classes will be taught by certified instructors and the classes will allow an introduction to a variety of technical programs that will lead right into a program of study upon high school graduation. The seniors have the option to take classes at either the Norfolk or South Sioux City, NE campus.

The seniors were allowed to register for classes from a wide range of interests. Some examples of classes are: Lifetime Wellness, Welding, Early Childhood Development, Medical Terminology, Nurse aide and Health, Safety, & Nutrition, just to name a few. To ensure the security and welfare of our students and staff, we have implemented a new access control system.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Building entry at the beginning of the school day will continue as normal.

Exterior doors will be unlocked in the morning from 7:00 a.m. – 8:15 a.m. for the morning arrival of students. After 8:15 a.m. all doors will automatically lock and visitors will be required to “buzz in” to gain access to the building through a closed circuit monitoring system.

Visitors will gain access through the double doors inside the foyer of the main entrance at the front of the school. Visitors will not be allowed access at any other location.

Procedures to enter the building:

1. To the right of the door is an intercom/camera.
2. Press the button on the intercom.
3. Someone will see you and will respond verbally.
4. They can then release the door for you to enter the building.
5. You will then report to the office.



We need your help and cooperation for our system to work effectively. Our office staff is handling multiple tasks and although they will work diligently to help you gain access into the building as quickly as possible, there may be a short delay until someone can view you on the monitor and allow access. Please help by identifying yourself. Again, all visitors must come to the office immediately after gaining access to the building.

We ask for your patience as we all get acquainted with this new system and remember that we have your child's best interest at heart.

Safety / Crisis Information

The Nebraska Department of Education is in the process of unifying language for safety procedures across schools in the state. The procedures requiring action are called “Standard Response Protocol” and consist of 4 main actions—lockout, lockdown, evacuate, and shelter. According to NDE, the Standard Response Protocol “is the uniform classroom immediate response to any incident. Protocol not only enables rapid response determination when an unforeseen incident occurs but also allows for a more predictable series of actions as an incident unfolds. By standardizing the vocabulary, everyone immediately involved can understand the response and status of the incident.”



Here at school, we will be practicing drills based on these four actions and discussing ways to improve our response effectiveness and timing. If you come to school and see a sign on the door, it will give information and indicate the type of drill being practiced. Please don't be alarmed, and just know that we are practicing so that we can better protect our students. **In the event that we would ever need to evacuate the building for any reason, our Parent Reunification Site will be the Methodist Church, 402 Summit Drive, Allen.**

In the case of an emergency, we would ask that parents and community members keep the following in mind:

- Parents and relatives should not respond to the incident site (**school**) or evacuation/reunification site (**Methodist Church**) to allow public safety personnel time to respond to the incident.
- Students will be released only to approved adults at the evacuation/reunification site (**Methodist Church**).
- All members of the community should avoid driving anywhere within several blocks of the incident or evacuation/reunification site.
- All members of the community should avoid using cellular phones for the first several hours of the situation. This is to help keep cellular phone service from collapsing, as it has in a number of school crisis events. School and public safety officials may be heavily reliant on cellular service during a crisis.
- Concerned parties should not call the school, school board members, or public safety dispatch centers to get information regarding the incident or particular students and employees. Personnel at these locations will be extremely busy, and often do not have information regarding each evacuee. Inquiries severely hamper efforts to manage the crisis properly.

We certainly hope we **NEVER** have to actually use these procedures, but we want to be as prepared and responsive as we can possibly be if we do.

PRESCRIPTIONS AND MEDICATIONS

Students needing prescriptions or over-the-counter medications at school must have written permission from a physician or dentist and written permission from their parent/guardian. Medications such as Tylenol and Ibuprofen will not be available at school for student use without permission.

Students are not allowed to carry any medications with them or to keep any medications in their lockers or vehicles. Any student needing or wanting to carry medications with them (such as an asthma inhaler) must have a permission form signed by their physician and parent/guardian. These forms are available at the school office. Any over-the-counter medications or prescription medications given here at the school will be administered through the Principal's office. The medications must be provided to the school in the original prescription bottle and will only be given as directed on the bottle. Any change in the dose or frequency/ times must be accompanied by written physical permission form. We must have a parent/guardian completed and signed permission form on file. These forms are also available at the principal's office. All medication that is to be given must be taken to the Principal's Office. Please do not send medications that have to be administered three times a day. Most can be safely given before school, after school, and at bedtime. Anyone giving medications in school must be designated by a registered nurse and pass a thorough medication provider course.



Requirements

Nebraska law requires that all students in Nebraska schools, grades K-12 have varicella vaccines or written proof of the chicken pox disease prior to starting school in August.

⇒ **Kindergarteners** must have a physical, eye exam, and kindergarten shots (including the 2 doses of varicella) prior to the first day of school.

⇒ **7th graders** must have a physical, tetanus booster and 2 doses of varicella or written proof of the disease, prior to the first day of school. All students in grades 7-12 who are going to participate in athletics must have a physical exam. Students may not participate with the team without evidence of the physical exam.

August Library News

Welcome back to another school year! Students and staff can look forward to new books, magazines, periodicals and other resources in our school's library media center! The custodians have been working hard over the summer and given our school's library media center a face lift. A fresh coat of paint with a pop of color as well as newly laid carpet and a different arrangement, has given the library media center a fresh face for the 2018-2019 school year.

Due to the success of last year's Scholastic Book Fairs, new library books have been purchased with Scholastic rewards dollars. A wide array of fiction and non-fiction on varied levels will be added to our school's collection. Due to the graciousness of funding allotted by our school board, the library is able to make purchases throughout the school year in order to ensure our students have updated access a variety of materials and resources.

Elementary library students, PK-4, will once again come to the library each week to check out books and learn key library skills. Upper Elementary students as well Junior High and High School students can check out as many books as needed at their convenience throughout the school day.

Just a reminder of the Allen Consolidated School circulation policy:

As a general rule, students are allowed to check out 2 books each week. More books can be checked out on an individual as needed basis. Books are due 2 weeks after the check-out date.

Magazines, newspapers, and other periodicals may be checked out on a daily basis. All periodicals must be returned by 4 pm each day.

These must be checked out at the circulation desk.

Students who have overdue materials are not allowed to check out new materials until the late items are returned or renewed.

No fines will be charged for late materials however, students who have lost or damaged their materials will be required to pay for them.

Bills will be sent home if these issues arise.

IPad, Laptop, and Chromebook carts are located in the library for student and staff use. Everyone must check out these materials with Mrs. Anderson at the circulation desk before taking them out of the library. All of these devices are due back by 4 pm each school day. Those students who fail to adhere to the device checkout procedures, will lose their device checkout privileges for 1 week.

Students and staff will have more flexibility with check out procedures in the library. A computer will be set up at the circulation desk for self-checkout of books, devices, periodicals and other materials. Students will be reinstructed on self-checkout procedures once classes are back in session. Staff will be instructed on an as needed basis.

The Pizza Hut Book It Program will once again be coming to Allen Elementary School! Students PK-6 will receive calendars to fill in each month to mark off according to reading goals set by their classroom teacher. Last year, teachers assigned students a nightly reading minute goal. The program officially runs from October-March. Look for your child's Book IT! calendar in late September.

"Birthday Books" is a new project for this upcoming school year. Students can come to the library to choose a free book to keep as a gift for their birthday. This program is for all students of the district, PK-12th grade. Books will be funded for this project from our semi-annual Scholastic Book Fairs. Summer birthday books will be distributed as follows:

May, June, July, and August 2019 Birthdays will be distributed before school lets out in May 2019.

The "Birthday Books" program will not officially start until the first day of school, Wednesday August 15, 2018.

***Students may need additional items for specific classes – these will be requested by the teacher at the appropriate time.**



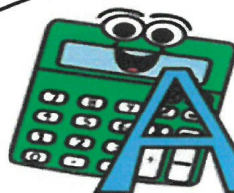

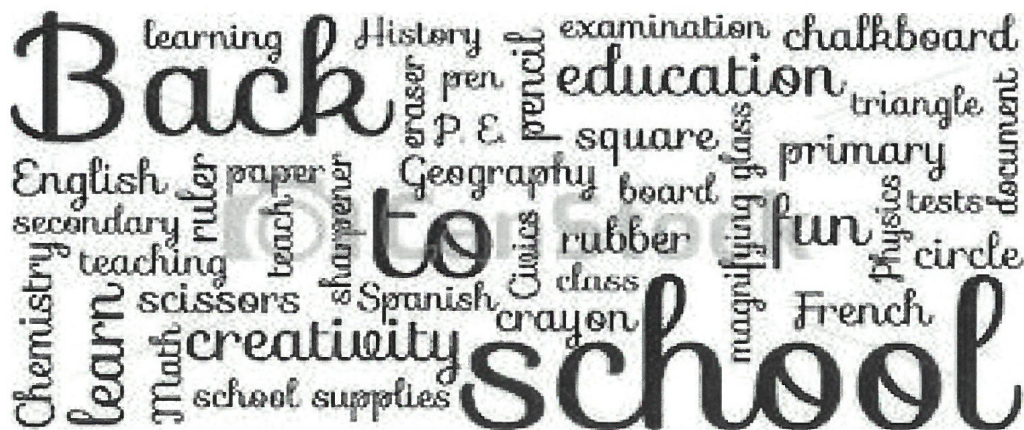
