### INFORMATION FROM THE SCHOOL BOARD

There has been a great deal of information spreading throughout the community involving the discussion of forming a co-operative agreement with area schools regarding girls' sporting activities. While some of this information is factual, some is not. The Allen Consolidated Schools Board of Education would like to address some of the reasons for considering this option as well as to provide an update to the community regarding this process.

The reason for considering entering in a co-operative union with another district in the area of girls' athletics is due to the fact that there has been a reduction in the number of girls who are participating in activities in grades five through ten. After the current junior class graduates, Allen Consolidated Schools will not have enough girl participants to field a volleyball or basket-ball team during the 2019-2020 season. Due to this reality, the Board of Education has been proactive in trying to form a co-operative agreement that could possibly start during the 2018-2019 school year. Proactive and preemptive measures such as considering entering into a co-operative agreement is beneficial to Allen for the following reasons: (1.) The district is able to explore options with neighboring schools, (2.) The district has a window of time to consider how to preserve the identity of the school and community should a co-operative agreement be reached, (3.) The district can establish a timeline with parameters determined by the board itself.

Initial discussions were started with Wakefield Community Schools regarding a cooperative agreement due to existing programs that are being shared. Examples include: wrestling (at Wakefield) and FFA (at Allen). Discussions regarding entering in to a co-operative partnership are not limited to the Wakefield school district. The school administration and activities department has also reached out to other area schools and discussed possible agreements. At this time, the Board is in the process of hearing what options are available with neighboring schools and essentially negotiating the best deal possible to offer activities to our female athletes, while maintaining the identity of Allen Consolidated Schools. When it is time to make a decision, the Board of Education will choose what is the best co-operative agreement for our students, our school, and our community.

It is important for the community to know that this is simply a sports co-operative agreement only. In no way is the Board of Education looking at combining schools with a neighboring community. The desired outcomes of being able to offer a strong activity program with a co-operative agreement is to continue to provide choices in programs that are offered to the students at Allen Consolidated Schools. Well established schools balance the opportunities for students to participate in activities while receiving a high-quality educational experience. This remains our focus and our goal for the Allen Consolidated Schools.

2. Create an FSA ID. You and a parent must each create a username and password at <u>fsaid.ed.gov</u> that will serve as your Federal Student Aid (FSA) IDs for the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). You will each need your own email address to create an FSA ID.

# 3. Complete the FAFSA at <u>fafsa.gov</u> on or after October

1. The FAFSA is your application for federal, state, and college-based financial aid. The colleges you list on the application will use that information to determine the types and amounts of financial aid they will award you.

### COUNSELOR'S OFFICE

It is officially fall and that means that Seniors are in full swing of applying for college and looking for scholar-ships. I have met with each senior individually and they have been applying to several different colleges. Some of the best scholarships are merit based, which depends solely on ACT scores, class rank, and GPA. Students generally do not have to apply for these, but may be awarded a merit scholarship through information given on their college application. Please remind and encourage your student to look for additional scholarships in my office or on several scholarship websites. Winning the scholarship game: Follow these tips to increase your chances of earning scholarships:

- (1) Don't pay for scholarship services! Free resources include <u>ScholarshipQuest</u> at Education-Quest.org, your school counselor's office, and EducationQuest offices in Omaha, Lincoln, and Kearney.
- (2) Focus on college-based and local scholarships. You're more likely to earn them over large national awards.
- (3) Continually update your activities, honors, and volunteer or paid jobs using the <u>Activities</u> Resume at EducationQuest.org.
- (4) Earn the best possible ACT/SAT scores by taking the exams in the spring of your junior year and again in the fall of your senior year.
- (5) Use quality references such as a teacher, coach or counselor. Give them advance notice, a specific deadline, and a copy of your Activities Resume.
- (6) Ask at least two people to proofread your application.

### COUNSELOR'S OFFICE

Student Mentoring will begin by the end of October. This involves many of our Juniors and Seniors mentoring an elementary student. It is a great way to build positive relationships and provides volunteerism and service for our high school students.





10th grade Career Day will take place on Oct. 17th at Wayne State College. The sophomores registered for various career tracks last spring. The students will attend up to 5 career sessions and enjoy lunch in the WSC cafeteria. This is a great opportunity for our students to learn about careers and spend a day on a college campus.

All sophomores will take the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) test on Oct. 25<sup>th</sup>. This is a free assessment that allows students to explore their strengths and weaknesses. The test is given to Juniors and Seniors interested in the military, but for our sophomores their scores cannot be released to the military and the assessment is only used as a career planning tool. On November 6<sup>th</sup>, Keith Jorgensen (Allen graduate!) will do a test inter-

pretation with all students that take the ASVAB.

Red Ribbon Week will be celebrated Oct 23-27<sup>th</sup>! On Tuesday, Oct. 24<sup>th</sup> the K-6 students will have a "Kids on the Block" presentation dealing with substance abuse issues. Will get more of this to you ASAP!



### Allen Consolidated Schools Improves Student Safety with TIPS



Just a reminder: the TIPS reporting link is on the school website and can be used to allow the anonymous reporting of bullying, weapons, abuse, vandalism, suicide risks and other concerning behaviors that may have a negative effect on the school's learning environment. TIPS can also be used to report acts of kindness or other make positive comments in something called a Hero report.

How it works: if you are worried about friends, students or others, or if you witness concerning behaviors, simply go to the Allen School website (<a href="www.allenschools.org">www.allenschools.org</a>) and click on the TIPS REPORT INCIDENT button.

Select the appropriate incident type, share the necessary details and then SUBMIT.

Once an incident report is made, the principal and designated staff members are immediately notified via email and can securely review the report details to begin coordinating an appropriate assessment and response. TIPS provides all team members with the right tools to track and document the actions taken, see related reports, set automated reminders, review past reports, check school policy, and connect the right dots so no students or incidents are overlooked.

Please keep in mind that due to confidentiality issues, it may not be possible for reporters to be informed on how their report was handled and/or how the situation was resolved.


goal each month, students will progress to a different oceanic area which will be displayed on our library bulletin board in the elementary hallway.
